What's the SC?

Pursuing a European vision of deepened cooperation in teaching, education, research and administration, 4EU+ has set out to establish an integrated European University System.

What's your role?

As an SC representative you will represent the students of Heidelberg University in individual 4EU+ sessions and votes and report back to the StuRa (Student Council) Task Force 4EU+.

Workload

The SC meets once a month by appointment.

Task Force 4EU+ meets every 1-4 weeks according to requirements. For every session, preparations and follow-ups are needed.

Who can run for the 4EU+ SC Committee membership?

All enrolled students of Heidelberg University are eligible. You should be communicative, a team player and — above all — motivated to contribute own ideas. As SC sessions will be in English, you should be able to adequately express yourself. A former active Task Forcemembership is recommended but not required.

How can you run for a membership?

As the next SC session will already be in October, Refkonf (Department Conference of the Student Council) can delegate temporary members because of exceptional urgency. However, the term of said members expires after the session. Afterwards, regular votes will take place within the StuRa.

There also will be a Q&A as well as a discussion among candidates and members of the StuRa. The final elections will most likely take place in the subsequent session (second reading) on November 2.
