

Housing Advice

The housing market in Heidelberg is very tight, so finding accommodation can be difficult. Start early and use multiple options:

- Other options: private (but costly) dorms in Bahnstadt
- Collegium Academicum





Tip: Don't limit your search to Heidelberg—surrounding towns (e.g. Dossenheim, Leimen, Weinheim, Neckargmünd) are cheaper and still well connected by public transport.

Mobility

Nextbike for Students

Heidelberg students can use **Nextbikes free for 30 minutes per ride**, unlimited times per day (with a 15-minute break between rentals). Extra time costs **0.50€ per half hour.** Simply register with your student email at <u>vrnnextbike.de</u> or via the app (check "CampusRad – Heidelberg University" under benefits). To rent, scan the bike's QR code in the app, unlock, ride, and return it at any VRNnextbike station.



Deutschlandticket

Students up to the age of 27 can get the D-Ticket JugendBW for 39.42€ per month (annual subscription, cancelable monthly after the first year). The ticket is valid on all public transport in Germany but you must carry your validated student ID. It can be purchased via the DB app/website, the rnv subscription service (start of contract always on the 1st of the month if ordered by the 20th, available as online or plastic card) or at any local rnv/VRN sales outlets. Note that it is not offered in the VRN Ticket App and does not apply as a nationwide semester ticket! Students over the age of 27 are only eligible for the regular Deutschlandticket (currently 58€/month). They are no longer eligible for the D-Ticket JugendBW.





Cultural Flatrates

Museum

Students of Heidelberg University enjoy free admission to the Kurpfaelzisches Museum as well as the Museum of Ethnology in Heidelberg. The admission to both museums is free upon presentation of a valid student ID card or current certificate of enrollment. No prior registration is required.

Theatre

For both, the **Taeter Theater Heidelberg** as well as the **Theater und Orchester Heidelberg**, **free tickets are available five days before the respective performance** and can be purchased free of charge either online or at the box office. **Here is how to obtain a ticket:**
